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JFC Announces 2014 Local Grants Program

Jewelers for Children has announced the 2014 edition of their Local Grants program. JFC has set aside \$100,000 to be used for ten \$10,000 grants to local organizations. Independent jewelers will nominate a local organization to receive one of these grants. The retailer is responsible for motivating their constituents to vote for their charity through a Facebook based campaign on JFC's page.

The nomination period for charities will run September 1-30. The voting process will begin on October 6, and end on October 19. The top 10 vote getters (winners) will be announced on October 22.

In 2013 GJA and its members won one of the \$10,000 grants for Cystic Fibrosis of GA when Jean Grant Graham (GJA past president, JC Grant Co) rallied everyone on facebook to the winning victory.


Scholarship Named for GJA's John W. Reed

At the August 2014 GJA board meeting the group voted to name the group's scholarship program the John W. Reed Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship, just three years old, was created during John's tenure as president of GJA. The scholarship is awarded to GJA members or their employees who want to pursue their education through GIA, AGS or other jewelry related educators.

Reed and his wife Patti founded JWR Jewelers in Athens and are both longtime supporters of GJA. JWR Jewelers is a member of the American Gem Society and John earned the title of Graduate Gemologist from the GIA. John's life was cut short in May of this year when he lost a short battle with cancer.



"It is our hope that John's loyalty to GJA will never be forgotten by naming this scholarship in honor of him" said GJA President Bill Rosenfeld after the meeting during the Atlanta Jewelry Show.



Jewelers Reward Fund Needs Your Help

Multiple rewards may be offered at the same time for unrelated crimes pending available funds. The availability of funds is where we need your help.
